Filing for benefits, changing an address, making an appointment, etc. can be done online. Open a mySocialSecurity account today and rest easy knowing that you are in control of your future. There are also informational videos on YouTube. Social Security pays benefits for children in three different situations as follows:

- **SSI Benefits for Children:** These benefits are payable to children with disabilities who have limited income and resources. In order to qualify, the child must have a condition that is expected to last a year or more.
- Social Security Dependents Benefits: These benefits are payable to children under age 18 (or 19 if the child is still in secondary school) on the record of a parent who is

- collecting retirement or disability benefits. Benefits are also payable to children on the record of a deceased parent who had worked under Social Security.
- Social Security Disabled Adult Child Benefits: Dependents benefits can be paid to individuals who became disabled before age 22. Like the benefits in the previous section, these are paid on the record of a parent receiving Social Security or on the record of a deceased parent who had worked under Social Security. Disabled adult child benefits are payable as long as an individual is disabled and not married.
- Help With Prescription Drug Costs: Medicare beneficiaries are eligible for the extra help if they have limited income and resources. The extra help can increase their cost savings by paying for part of the monthly premiums, annual deductibles and prescription co-payments under the new prescription drug program. The extra help could be worth an average of \$3,700 per year.

(502 Loan) Low interest loans are made directly by USDA Rural Development to applicants whose incomes are less than 80 percent of the median income for the area. This program is focused towards purchasing modest housing, constructing new homes, or repairing pre-owned dwellings, located in rural areas of Maine. (Very Low to Low income)

(504 Loan) Loans are made at 1 - percent interest rate to repair, improve, or modernize modest single family homes in rural areas, making homes safer or more sanitary; or to remove health and safety hazards. (515 Loan) Loans made by USDA Rural Development to build or repair elderly or family apartment style housing in rural areas for very low, low and moderate income residents. Up to 102 percent of the appraised value or development costs, whichever is less, can be borrowed by non-profits and up to 97 percent can be borrowed by limited profits.

(521 RA) Tenant subsidy that provides assistance for very-low and low-income residents of Section 515 Rural Rental Housing apartments. Tenants are required to pay 30 percent of their adjusted monthly income for shelter costs.

WORD/TERM DEFINITIONS

- Acute Symptoms come on suddenly and last for a short time.
- **Adjustment Disorder** A debilitating reaction to a stressful event or situation that usually lasts less than six months.
- Advocate An individual who speaks or acts on behalf of another.
- **Anorexia Nervosa** A condition of self-inflicted starvation resulting in body weight that is at least 15% below the normal range. The condition is most prevalent in adolescent females.
- **Anxiety** A feeling of apprehension, tension, or uneasiness that stems from the anticipation of danger from a largely unknown source, which may be internal or external. Symptoms include muscle tension, spontaneous hyperactivity, nervousness, and vigilance.
- Attention Deficit Disorder (ADD) The person is easily distracted and has difficulty staying focused on an individual activity for any length of time.
- Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) Same as ADD with the additional symptoms of hyperactivity and impulsiveness; all symptoms are usually present before age 7.
- Behavior Disorder (BD) 1. In children displaying behaviors that are significantly deviant from socially acceptable norms for their age and situation and occur over long periods of time. 2. In adults It implies an inability to care for oneself, function appropriately in society, and may present a threat to themselves or others due to behavioral excesses or deficits.
- **Bipolar Disorder** A major affective disorder in which there are episodes of both mania and depression, it may be subdivided into manic, depressed, or mixed types.
- Case Management (Service Coordination) A service that provides assistance in
 obtaining, monitoring, and coordinating community services such as: medical and/
 or mental health evaluation and care, housing, education, income assistance, recreation, etc.
- Level 1 level of needs are low, generally a one-on-one helping relationship with the individual and/or parent/guardian.
- Level 2 involves a moderate to high level of need and often uses a team approach that is guided by the parent/guardian.
- Case Manager (Service Coordinator) An individual that performs case management duties.
- **Cerebral Palsy (CP)** The name for a collection of movement disorders caused by brain damage that occurs before, during, or shortly after birth. A person with CP is often also affected by other conditions caused by brain damage.
- **Chronic -** Symptoms last a long time, often a year or more.
- **Congenital** Occurring before birth
- **Crisis** A state of being, an intense situation or feeling when an individual's normal ability to cope with life issues breaks down.

- **Crisis Intervention or Stabilization** A program designed to assist an individual in crisis to become stabilized.
- **Cystic Fibrosis (CF)** An inherited disease that affects the lungs, digestive system, sweat glands, and male fertility. Its name derives from the fibrous scar tissue that develops in the pancreas.
- **Day Care/Day Treatment** A program that provides specialized care, teaching, and/ or supervision during the day.
- Depressed A type of bipolar disorder characterized by lowered mood, slowed thinking, decreased movement or agitation, loss of interest, guilt, lowered self esteem, sleep disturbance and decreased appetite.
- Depression Is a treatable illness that produces feelings of indifference, emptiness, worthlessness, and apathy; as well as loss of pleasure in daily activities and irritability at an extreme level. Depression can make even the most basic of life functions, such as sleeping, eating, and thinking, very difficult.
- **Developmental Disability** A chronic disability that is caused by mental and/or physical impairments that manifest by age 21, are likely to continue indefinitely, and result in substantial functional limitations that require special care and/or services.
- **Early Intervention** Providing services to infants and children with disabilities from birth to age 5.
- **Entitlement** A service or right guaranteed by law.
- **Evaluation** An appraisal of specific characteristics such as intelligence, personality, physical aspects, or vocational readiness.
- **Family Support Services** Services provided to families that have member(s) with disabilities at home. Such as: respite care, counseling, transportation, support groups, adaptive equipment, etc.
- **Family Therapy** Therapy designed to improve relationships and understanding between family members.
- **Genetic Counseling S**ervices that determine the likelihood that a genetic or hereditary disorder may occur in a family.
- **Group Home** A supervised home for a small number of individuals with disabilities within the community.
- **Guardianship** Authority granted to an individual, by Probate Court, to make decisions on behalf of another person that has been determined to be incapacitated.
- **Inclusion (education)** Inclusion is the process of including all students in regular classes, with necessary supports.
- **Independent Living (supported living)** A disabled person living as independently as possible in the community with the necessary supports provided.
- **Job Coach** An individual who assists another, on or off the job, in developing the necessary skills to become and stay employed.
- Learning Disability A brain processing problem involved with understanding or using language, which may interfere with the individual's ability to listen, think, speak, read,

write, spell, or perform math functions.

- Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW) An individual with a Master's Degree in Social Work who has worked two years under direct supervision and has been licensed by the state. They can provide individual, group, and family therapy, assessments, and consultations among other things.
- **Mainstreaming** The placement of a special needs student in a classroom where equal expectations apply to all students.
- Manic A type of bipolar disorder that is characterized by excitement, euphoria, expansive or irritable mood, hyperactivity, pressured speech, flight of ideas, decreased need for sleep, distractibility, and impaired judgment. Delusions consistent with elation and grandiosity may be present.
- Mental Health Diagnosis Axis I diagnosis a mental illness such as: ADHD, ADD, ODD, Depression, Adjustment Disorder, Bipolar, etc. Axis II diagnosis Intellectual Disabilities, Autism, PDD (pervasive developmental disorder), Personality Disorders. Axis III diagnosis a medical condition. Axis IV diagnosis a psychosocial or environmental problem that is brought on by a persons circumstances. Axis V diagnosis GAF (Global Assessment of Functioning) this is a rating from 1 to 100 that rates a persons ability to function at the time of assessment.
- **Mixed** A type of bipolar disorder that is characterized by both manic and depressive symptoms.
- **Natural Supports** Non-paid individuals in a person's life that provide a positive influence, which supports that person's ability to function as independently as possible within the community.
- Neurological Evaluation Is an extensive (6 12 hours) evaluation of specific cognitive and behavioral functions.
- **Neuroses** Behavior that involves a partial disorganization, characterized by combinations of anxieties, compulsions, and phobias.
- Oppositional Defiant Disorder A recurring pattern of negative, hostile, disobedient, and defiant behavior in a child or adolescent, lasting for at least six months without serious violation of the basic rights of others.
- **Personality Disorder** Behavior type disorders that are typified by the person being overly anxious, extremely shy, and/or extremely sad much of the time. The person's abilities to relate, to perceive, and to think tend to be inflexible, deeply ingrained, and maladaptive, which result in impaired functioning and/or distress. Onset usually occurs by adolescence or earlier, continues through adulthood, and tends to diminish by middle or old age.
- **Pervasive Developmental Disorder (PDD)** 1. It is a vague diagnosis characterized by severe distortions or delays in the development of social behavior and language. 2. A term sometimes used to describe the results of prenatal drug exposure, which may include: an extremely short attention span, behavior disorders, limited or nonexistent processing skills, and difficulty understanding spoken words.
- Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) A debilitating condition that affects people

who have been exposed to a major traumatic event. PTSD is characterized by upsetting memories or thoughts of the ordeal, "blunting" of emotions, increased arousal, and sometimes severe personality changes.

- **Psychological Evaluation** Is a series of personality and intellectual assessments.
- Psychologist An individual that has earned a Ph.D., performed an internship, and is
 licensed by the state. They can provide individual, group, and family therapy, assessments, testing, and consultations among other things, but cannot prescribe medications.
- **Psychiatrist** Is an individual with a Medical Degree (Dr.) and extensive training in psychotherapy. They are the only therapists that can prescribe medications.
- Release of Information A signed document giving permission to an individual and/ or agency to obtain and review confidential information about an individual.
- **Respite Care** Temporary care provided to a person with a disability that allows the regular caregiver to have a break from the constant demands of care giving.
- **Screening** Is the process of using a series of health, hearing, vision, developmental, and behavioral tests to identify handicaps in children.
- **Syndrome** Is a set of symptoms that collectively identifies a disease or disorder.
- **Transition (relating to education)** The process of leaving high school and entering adult life, which may include college and/or work.
- **Teletypewriter (TTY)** A special typewriter that converts typed messages into electronic signals and sends them over telephone lines to be printed at the other end by complementary equipment. Used by persons who are deaf or hearing impaired.


