Children participated in ACAP's Early Head Start, Head Start or Child Care programs that provide comprehensive child development services, prenatally through age five.

Aroostook County Collectively:

- The Aroostook CA\$H Coalition filed 1,094 tax returns thanks to 915 volunteer hours.
- 2,425 Students received fluoride and oral health screenings, and 164 students received sealants.
- 500 Women were given free prenatal vitamins in partnership with Vitamin Angels.
- 300 Students were provided the CATCH Curriculum across Aroostook
- 120 Restorative Justice Practice Talking Circles were hosted in schools throughout Aroostook
- 3,952 volunteer hours were contributed by community members to ACAP in a variety of program areas including Early Care and Education, CA\$H tax program, boards, and committee work.
- 9 First-Time Homebuyer Education Classes were held. A total of 99 future homeowners learned from industry professionals about how the buying process works as well as about credit and debit management, budgeting and more.
- Mobile Service Unit traveled over 1,200 miles to 25 communities across Aroostook County to help ensure that individuals and families in hard-to-reach locations can access the support and resources they need.
- 263 moms utilized the Breastfeeding Peer Counselor Program.
- 28 local partner organizations implemented physical activity, nutrition and/or breastfeeding strategies.
